

# Memory Verses

#### Why Memorize?

Memorizing scripture is an excellent way to worship God and allow him to mold you and use you. It is your sword which can be used offensively and defensively in spiritual battle. King David wrote, "I have hidden your word in my heart that I might not sin against you (Psa. 119:11, NIV). It helps you witness, teach and pray. "All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the man of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work" (2 Tim. 3:16-17, NIV). Blessed is the man whose "delight is in the law of the LORD, and on his law he meditates day and night. He is like a tree planted by streams of water, which yields its fruit in season and whose leaf does not wither. Whatever he does prospers" (Psa. 1:2-3, NIV). "Do your best to present yourself to God as one

approved, a workman who does not need to be ashamed and who correctly handles the word of truth" (2 Tim. 2:15, NIV).

#### How to Memorize?

There is no prescription for memorizing scripture, but here are some suggestions that may help God's word become a natural part of your lifestyle.

- Read the verse dozens of times out loud.
- Write down the verse.
- Learn what the verse means.
- Find logical breakpoints to segment the verse into smaller phrases. For instance,
- For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have everlasting life.

- Repeat each segment until it is memorized then connect the segments into a whole verse.
- Create a simple tune to put the verse to music.
- Utilize idle time to learn the verse. Put it in your pocket or purse, on the dash of your car, your desk at work, your computer desktop, your cell phone, the bathroom mirror, or the breakfast table.
- Practice reciting what you have learned to someone else. For instance, use it for spiritual discussions with family members at meal times.
- Periodically review the verses you have learned.
